## Introduction The aim of 'Community Led **Local Development'**

This report sets out the results of an impact measurement pilot in relation to the 2023-24 CLLD programme across Scotland. It shows an overall Social Return on Investment of £3.70/£1 Compared to £4.02/£1 for 2022/23

'Community Led Local Development' or 'CLLD' gives local communities the power to tackle their own, local challenges. By building knowledge and skills, supporting new ideas and encouraging cooperation, CLLD helps to create viable and resilient communities.

The Scottish Government committed £11.6 million of funding for financial year 2023-24 to support CLLD across rural and island Scotland, which includes a first tranche of statutory funding (£6.7m) ringfenced for resource use by the CLLD Local Action Group (LAG) network.

A top up of £2.9m capital for use by LAGs was allocated, bringing the total amount of funding directed to the Local Action Groups to £9.6m.

The remaining £2m funding was used to support collaboration activities reflecting rural priorities moving forward.

CLLD aims to address social, environmental and economic issues and include actions affecting rural and island communities to: • drive community action on climate change • enhance rural services and facilities, including transport

- initiatives
- enhance natural/cultural heritage, tourism and leisure
- chains, community food)
- build co-operation with similar groups in Scotland, UK and Europe
- empowering communities to exchange learning and opportunities for all

In September 2022 as part of the roll out of the CLLD programme, the Scottish Government agreed to equip each of the Local Action Groups, with the facility to assess the social impact of their activities. This was achieved through the purchase of access to the only UK accredited online software tool for assessing social impact, the Social Value Engine.



## **The Social Value Engine**

#### The Social Value Engine

The Social Value Engine was developed in 2013. It is an online tool with UK wide adoption used by a community of approaching 400 practitioners. The tool has over 500 financial proxies, sourced from open published sources which provide a framework to enable users to make their own judgements about the social value delivered by their activities. It follows the international good practice defined by Social Value International (SVI) in the formula used to assess social impact and is independently accredited by SVI.

#### **Assessment of Social Value**

The introduction of the SVE mid-way through the programme provided an opportunity for LAGs, where projects were sufficiently advanced and of appropriate scale to assess their social impact.

Each LAG was provided with the opportunity to use the Engine and linked to a nominated supporter from the Social Value Engine team to support them in the use of the tool. A template was created which identified a core list of financial proxies within the SVE for LAGs to choose from in assessing impact for each of the projects appropriate for assessment. Details are set out in the table overleaf:

This list was derived by assessing the match between the most appropriate proxy values within the SVE and the core themes for the CLLD programme. This was the second year of the use of the SVE and the first opportunity to embed it thoroughly with all participating LAGs. This enabled those LAGs which were most engaged with the tool to go "off piste" and identify other proxies from the overall list of SVE measures to create the tightest possible fit to their projects in terms of impact. Rose Regeneration supported this process and so whilst the above template represents the core of the SVE measures used a greater diversity of measurement has been achieved. Taking account of the enhanced emphasis on participation as a core Scottish Government priority we also added two other bespoke financial proxies to cover this priority they were:

The lead body involved in the deployment of the SVE, Rose Regeneration, convened a series of discussions with a small group of key informants from the rural research community in Scotland including representatives from SRUC and the James Hutton Institute. There was no direct involvement of either of these organisations in the application of the work. They were simply engaged in a discussion about the project to help provide useful linkages and context for the SVE team in working with LAGs.

Each participating LAG was able to identify the most appropriate projects to assess. With the support of the SVE officer they then decided from the project application form and their knowledge of the project more widely which of the template proxies to apply to that project. As part of the reporting process linked to their claims process each LAG was then able to collect information on the scale of activity associated with each chosen proxy area. With the support of the SVE officer and with reference to an additionality table which is derived from UK norms for different categories of project, each project was adjusted to take account of: leakage, deadweight, displacement, drop off and attribution. The SVE also aligns each of the outcomes achieved to the Sustainable Development Goals and this provided an opportunity for each participating LAG to generate an overview of the contribution of each assessed project to the sustainability of their area.

All CLLD participating LAGs were able to deploy the tool in detail across a representative number of projects This is a major achievement and shows the depth of embedding across the programme as previously only 12 of the partnerships had the capacity to engage with the tool substantively. The depth of participation enables us to reflect in a comprehensive way on the impact of the whole programme in addition to its more localised impacts at the level of individual LAGs. The portfolio of projects assessed by each LAG, the collective value (ie CLLD funding and match) and the programme wide social return for all the LAG projects assessed is set out below.

It is important to note that not every project within each of the geographies was included in the assessment process. Some areas took a value judgement where projects were either very small or related to feasibility studies, as to whether to assess the social value or not. We have removed these and also those individual project assessments where it was not possible to collect enough data from the applicant to generate a credible social return on investment ratio. We set the benchmark for reporting SROI at a maximum of  $\pounds 10/\pounds 1$ , apart from by exception where we have very strong data to justify a higher ratio.

The listing below shows the social return delivered against those projects where we felt confident that a meaningful interpretation of impact was possible. It is not a league table. Whilst it is useful to have a sense of the social return delivered across each geographical area based on the portfolio of projects assessed, the selective approach to choosing only projects where we have robust data and the different context in every area introduce a level of nuance which mitigates against an assumption that it is straightforwardly possible to compare like with like. This is why we have also considered the distribution of types of intervention across the whole CLLD portfolio and the impacts in relation to the Sustainable Development Goals from an overall programme perspective to provide a rounded view of impact. The list shows the area, the number of projects assessed and the SROI associated with their projects.

# The Social Value Engine Scottish Government Priority Linkages

The 372 projects have been aligned with the top 4 Scottish Government priorities. Where more than one priority is addressed by a project a value judgement has been made as to the most appropriate fit. Where projects align with more than one priority they have been allocated to each priority of relevance. The fact that several projects align effectively with more than one priority means the total figure of alignments set out in the table below exceeds 372.

## The Social Value Engine **Key Learning and Reflections**

- This activity has entailed a significant additional commitment from projects on the ground in terms of both project delivery bodies and the LAG administrative staff for which we are grateful. Our feedback from those who have made that time commitment is that the tool has enabled them to put the achievements and challenges faced by individual projects and their wider geographical areas into a clear and useful context.
- It has been possible in this programme to universally apply the tool and it has provided some real insights about the wider impact of the CLLD programme on a place basis.
- Through the learning in this process we have been able to refine the core list of financial proxies which would constitute a future approach going forward based on the proxy list above.
- We have also developed some process insights about how to most effectively collate data for future iterations of the programme. We believe a more direct engagement with projects at a proportionate level, respecting the lead and "sovereignty" of the LAGs would enable us to develop a "slicker" reporting process.
- At a national level we have a definitive sample, based on those who have participated, covering all LAGS which demonstrates at the place based level: the social impact of CLLD in terms of: a ratio; the key themes addressed by programmes in terms of Scottish Government priorities and social impacts in terms of financial proxies. This enables the impact of the programme to be more widely reported for the geographies concerned showing its particular impact in terms of the environment, young people, health and well-being, inclusion, the building of VCS capacity and the local economy. CLLD has delivered a social return at the programme level for each LAG area in the

range of £1.35 - £8.08 for 2023/4. This compares to £1.24 to £4.86 for 2022/23 and represents a highly credible range of impact ratios. The overall SROI of the programme - £3.70/£1 compared to £4.02/£1 for 2022/23 shows good consistency. The range of proxies chosen in 2023/4 compared to 2022/23 and the ranking for the whole programme of the SDGs delivered compared to 2022/23 show a good degree of consistency over both years measured as set out in the report above. This is a programme which over both years has built the capacity of rural and coastal places to be more inclusive whilst seeking to strengthen local economies with a major focus in some areas on a just transition towards reducing carbon usage and CO2 emissions. It has put an emphasis on building volunteering and widening participation, including in relation to jobs and skills.

• In some LAG areas there was significant interest in the wider use of the SVE and we have the potential to build the effective measurement of programme activity through greater group insight should the tool be used in the next round of CLLD. We will do this by continuing to provide a social value "buddy" for each LAG. We also believe that the additional insights developed through the tool gives places the capacity to both better communicate what has been achieved and in future to think through the impact of their work more effectively.

• There was a clear relationship between the depth and robustness of the assessment process and the engagement and enthusiasm of each area. This did not relate to the number of projects assessed in each area, rather the depth of time spent on each measurable project. In most areas there was real enthusiasm and ownership of the process whilst a modest number of areas were more reluctant to engage as deeply as their peers.
